PROPOSED NATIONAL BYLAWS AMENDMENTS

Pursuant to National SAR Bylaw No. 35, Section 1 -Amendments, the Indiana SAR proposes the following bylaw changes and submits them to the Secretary General and Executive Director for distribution to the General Officers, Board of Trustees, the Executive Committee, State Society Presidents and Secretaries.

Bylaw No. 20. Nominating Committee and Nomination Procedure

Section 1. Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee interviews and considers candidates for National Society General Officers and the SAR Foundation Board.

(a) Membership. Eligibility to be seated on the committee is determined as of the Spring Leadership/Trustees' Meeting. The membership of the Nominating Committee, as of that date, shall consist of:

(i) ~~Five (5)~~ **Two (2)** most immediate, living former Presidents General who are able and willing to serve;

(ii) ~~Four (4)~~ **Six (6)** State Society Presidents, as selected by the Council of State Presidents pursuant to its Bylaws; provided that, the State Society Presidents chosen shall not be a president of the state society in which the former Presidents General identified in (a)(i) resided during their respective terms of office; and

(iii) ~~Two (2)~~ **Three (3)** National Trustees, to be appointed by the **currently seated** President General; provided that, the National Trustees chosen must shall not be a trustee for a state society represented in (a)(i), **or (a)(ii), a General Officer, Vice-President General, or a President General.**

Nominating Procedure

Purpose: The current procedure of the Nominating Committee is to decide the single best candidate for each office. In order to establish a system that better exemplifies the "representative government" system that our patriot ancestors created when establishing the United States, where the people decide the best person for each office by allowing multiple people to run for each position through an election process, so that the people have a choice of who their leader is and not a tyrannical, fascist, or other non-democratic process, we believe that there should be multiple options to select from for each general officer position.

Bylaw No. 20. Nominating Committee and Nomination Procedure

Section 2. Nomination Procedure.

(d) Nominating Committee Meeting. The Chairman shall conduct a meeting of the Committee at the site of and on the day preceding the Spring Board of Trustees' Meeting. The Committee shall consider all supporting data submitted with the names of suggested nominees. At its discretion, the Nominating Committee may invite any interested Compatriot to appear personally if he has made such a request of the

In Memorium

It is with deep regret and sorrow that I recognize the death of Compatriot George Herbert Walker Bush, 41st President of the United States on Friday November 30, 2018. He was 94 years of age. President Bush was a member of the Patrick Henry Chapter Texas SAR since 2001. His Patriot Ancestor was Samuel Herrick. President Bush was a veteran of WWII, having joined the Navy



on his 18th birthday in 1942, becoming the youngest aviator in the U.S. Navy at the time. Upon leaving the Navy in September 1945, he attended and graduated from Yale University. He had a lifetime of public service including Congressman, Ambassador to China, Director of Central Intelligence Agency, Vice President (2 terms), and 41st President of the United States 1989-1993. His Presidential Library was dedicated in 1997, and he was active in humanitarian activities.

At the time of his death, he was the longest-lived American president in history. President Bush was a true Patriot who devoted much of his life to public service. The SAR is proud that he was a member of our organization, and is saddened by his passing. Our condolences also go out to his entire family, including his son and fellow SAR Compatriot President George H. Bush (43rd President).

With the help of words from our SAR Prayer Book, I share this thought. Lord, keep in our memory, Compatriot George H.W. Bush, who we mourn today, a member who along with many of his generation, was a light of our nation's greatest generation, who now serves you in your Eternal Kingdom. Compatriots, keep the family of President Bush in your thoughts and prayers as we join our nation in remembering President George Herbert Walker Bush. May he Rest in Peace!

Special Observance

Missing In America

On November 03, 2018 the "Missing in America Project" (MIAP) had a "Call to Honor #17-Florida" at the Cape Canaveral National Cemetery. The cremains of 24 unclaimed Veterans and their spouses were recognized in this memorial. These Veterans served from WWI to current times. One WWI veteran passed away in 1964.

Also there were other Veterans that were identified and will have services at their final resting place. One Veteran will be united with his son in New Jersey. Three Spouses will be united with their husbands at Arlington National Cemetery, Florida National Cemetery and Bay Pines National Cemetery. Currently there are other Veterans and spouses that have been identified and will be interred at a later date. MIAP tries to have a maximum of 20 cremains for each memorial service.



Compatriot Donn Weaver was instrumental in his coordinating of the internment proceedings. Compatriot Carl Miller had the honor to be a Pallbearer, Compatriot Brian Jensen took images of the services and is ensuring that the Veterans Center in Merritt Island has copies for their archives. Several Brevard DAR chapters were in attendance and assisted with the memorial services.

Many of these Veterans and spouses had obituaries placed in the media, but sadly nobody claimed their remains due to unknown circumstances. Various organizations have provided resources to buy or build urns, provide nameplates and service medallions for these heroes and their spouses.

IMAP was organized in 2007 and has been active

beneficial to the society through long term goals. This also impacts the work of the committees, as each year the PG appoints chairmen and committee members.

Additionally, following the election of officers, campaigning for the next positions currently begin ten days following their election into the current position. An officer cannot properly focus on their current position when immediately campaigning for the next position. Campaigning should be restricted to a limited time before an election, a maximum of one year being acceptable. A large amount of monies and efforts are dedicated to campaigning and these personal resources could be better utilized by directing those funds and dedication into accomplishments through SAR programs and projects.

Constitution of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution Article IV. Officers and Trustees

Section 1. The General Officers of this Society shall be a President General, a Vice-President General for each of the regularly established districts within the United States as specified in the Bylaws and one or more Vice-Presidents General for outside areas - provided that the Board of Trustees shall so provide, Secretary General, Treasurer General, Chancellor General, Genealogist General, Registrar General, Historian General, Librarian General, Surgeon General, and Chaplain General, who shall be elected by ballot by a majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the Annual Congress of the Society and shall hold office for ~~one year~~ **two years except for Vice-Presidents General who will continue to hold office for one year** or until their successors are elected and qualified. Such General Officers shall serve without compensation in such capacities. **This change is effective for the 2022 Congress elections.**

Bylaw #19 Nominating Committee and Nomination Procedure

Section 2. Nomination Procedure
(a) Announcement of Candidacy for General Office. Neither a Compatriot who seeks a National Society office, nor may any other person or entity circulating his resume on his behalf and commence seeking endorsements less than ~~10 days~~ **one year** after the conclusion of the immediately preceding Congress. A Compatriot who seeks National Society Office shall advise the Chairman of the National Society's Nominating Committee not later than December 31 **of the year preceding the next Congress** of his intent to serve if elected. A Compatriot who fails to notify the Nominating Committee Chairman by the aforementioned date will not be considered an effective candidate for National Society office by the Nominating Committee. **This change is effective for the 2022 Congress elections.**

Chairman in advance of the meeting day. Candidates for office may be requested to appear before the Nominating Committee by its Chairman. At the conclusion of deliberations, written and oral presentations having been considered, the Committee ~~shall vote to choose one nominee for each office~~ **shall choose those nominees that are qualified for each office based on the job descriptions in the Constitution and Bylaws. Multiple candidates for each office is acceptable and ideal. If one of three (3) or more names suggested for any office does not receive a majority, the name with the lesser vote shall be stricken for each subsequent ballot until one shall have received the necessary majority.. In the event of a tie between two or more suggested nominees for any office, all names shall be listed as nominees.**

Two-Year Terms for Elected General Officers

Purpose: The current one year term of office does not allow officers enough time to propose, implement and complete programs and projects

Wreaths Across America

December 15, 2018

The thirteenth annual Wreaths Across America took place across the nation, in addition this year wreaths were also laid at the graves of those fallen heroes who lay at the Normandy American Cemetery in Colleville-sur-Mer, France. One of 14 World War II military cemeteries located on foreign soil. There are 9,387 soldiers buried at Normandy. Wreaths were also placed at all five D-Day invasion beaches. These wreaths were donated by WAA founder Morrill Worcestor.



In 1992 Worcestor, a wreath maker had 5,000 extra wreaths. He arranged to have the wreaths delivered to Arlington National Cemetery. Word got out inside the Pentagon of unexpected delivery. Many able-bodied individuals assembled at the cemetery in order to unload the truck and lay the wreaths at the deceased Veterans graves. Brevard SAR Chapter past President and current Secretary Barry Eller was in Washington DC at the time the wreaths were delivered. Compatriot Eller will tell of the beginning of a noteworthy endeavor when promoting wreaths within the Chapter. Morrill has donated wreaths ever since and in 2007 Wreaths Across America was organized as a 501C(3) organization.

Brevard is very fortunate to be home of the Cape Canaveral National Cemetery. This year was the cemetery's third WAA ceremony, the support of the local community was overwhelming. There was as much as four times more people standing than there were in the available seats. A mule driven caisson held seven



wreaths, one for each branch of service, Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, Navy as well as POW/ MIA's and Merchant Marines. The caisson was guided by two individuals wearing Civil War attire. This years' keynote speech was given by Rear Admiral Wayne Justice. Although a rainstorm was present just prior to and during the initial portion of the ceremony many standing gathered around the PA speakers to listen to Admiral Justice's speech. A special thanks was given to the Walmart truck driver who delivered the wreaths.

After the ceremony, wreaths were placed on the approxi-

mately 4,600 gravesites excluding those that were requested not to have wreath placement by direction of next of kin. Brevard SAR raised funds to provide 60 wreaths this year, proceeds of November's 50/50 went to our contribution. Compatriots Donn Weaver and Brian Jensen were present at this year's ceremony. Compatriot Weaver is very instrumental in supporting Veterans in the county in multiple capacities. I had the opportunity to talk to two individuals whom had their loved ones interned at the cemetery this past year and both were very grateful to the staff in their assistance during their time of loss.
