Compatriot Norm Desmarais reported on Tuskegee Airman Flight Officer Edwin Cowan who passed away in 2009. Edwin and his wife Theda's cremains were buried at a church in Merritt Island. Compatriot Ray Norman and Bill Kowalcyk found their urns by using metal poles to locate their urns. Edwin and Theda will be laid to rest at Cape Canaveral National Cemetery Thursday 07 Feb 2019 at 15:00hrs.

Barry Eller and James Ward sold tickets for the 50/50 drawing during the recess. \$164.00 was raised and 82.00 went into the fund.

President Bonnett recessed the meeting for lunch, Reverend David Ralston gave the blessing for the meal.

The meeting was called back to order. Keynote Speaker was Sheriff Wayne Ivey. Sheriff Ivey spoke of the proactive measures his administration has taken to lower crime within the county. The Sheriff's Office oversees the nations 2nd largest passenger port. Animal Control has changed the animal adoption rate to about 98% of animals taken in by the county. Several programs

have been initiated to curb juvenile violence, rehabilitate and train inmates in OSHA standards so they can enter the construction work force once released. This effort is accomplished by teaming up with the Construction industry within the county.

### National News RECORD COPIES AVAILABLE ONLINE

Posted on Thursday, February 21, 2019 Author: Michael Scroggins

For the first time, the National Society is making available the ability to order a record copy of an application online with credit card payment. Currently, only the record copies for which the applicant's name, national number, and patriot ancestor are provided can be ordered using this system.

This will significantly reduce the amount of time for a member to receive a copy of an application. Most copies will be returned by email the same business day the order is placed. Please keep in mind that holidays, vacation days, and sick days may delay the processing of record copy requests, including those ordered online.

This system cannot be used for an ancestor search or a documentation request. Those may become available at a later date.

Please keep in mind that record copies of living members of the SAR are restricted to members of the SAR, DAR, and C.A.R. You are required to enter your national number to place an order.

Compatriot Doug Bisset gave a History Moment on "Cheshire—Jefferson Cheese". The Cheese was made in Cheshire Massachusetts from 900 cows. The block weighed 1,235 lbs and was 4' wide 15" thick. The 500-mile trip took 3 weeks to be delivered to Washington DC.

Compatriot James Burnett gave appreciation to Fuller (Sonny) Jones for his help in becoming a SAR member. Compatriot James Dempsey gave words on their Patriot Joseph Burch

Compatriot Jerry Scarpate provided an update to our youth programs. A silver ROTC Metal was presented at the Florida Institute of Technology, a Silver Good Citizenship Metal was presented to Eastern Florida State College, Bronze JROTC Metals were presented at 14 high schools within the county. There was a total of 19 presentations with 20 awards. For 2019 we are planning on giving out 22 awards including two for the Scouts of America BSA.

Keynote Speaker was Compatriot Donn Weaver. Donn talked about the Stand Down that occurred at the Cocoa Armory on January 26, 2019. Planning took over 6 months to coordinate this event. 169 homeless and other Veterans were supported including 28 dependents. There were over 250 Volunteers and Vendors, 45 were JRTC and Sea Cadets (Rockledge, Viera, Coura-

geous Div). The event was organized with 61 support and information stations. The event was covered with at least four media

outlets including TV Newspapers, and local Magazine support with pre-coverage before the event. Four vans provided transportation to and for the recipients. Repairs and distribution of 25 bicycles were provided. More than \$5800 was raised during the event. Next years event will be called a Stand Up. Don also gave information on the re-burial of Edwin and Theda Cowan that took place at Cape Canaveral Cemetery on 07 Feb 2019. He also gave an update on the MIAP project.

### In Memorium

### Benjamin DuBose

Hon. Benjamin M. DuBose, age 80, went to meet his maker on January 7, 2019.

He was a loving husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather. He is survived by his: wife Geraldine, daughter Tracy Steiner & husband Rob in Cocoa; Son Jeff DuBose and wife Celeste in Groveland, three grandchildren; Tina Morgan, Gino and Christian Alleva; and three great-grandchildren, Gio, Bella and Vivi Alleva.

Mr .DuBose was born in the Canarsie section of Brooklyn, NY and graduated PS 115, McBurney H.S. and Brooklyn College with a degree in Police Science. He became a police officer with the Port Authority of NY & NJ and retired in 1979. During his tenure he was elected as a union delegate for over a dozen years before being elected Vice President for six years. He also served as a State and National delegate for the second largest police department in the State of NY

In 1964, during the Barry Goldwater days he was a Founder of the New York State Conservative Party and for over twenty years he was a state elected official for his party. He ran unsuccessfully for the NYS Senate in a predominantly Democratic area in Brooklyn, and received the Republican nomination as well.

Throughout the 1980s and into the 1990s he was the Executive Director for the Flatlands Development Corp. A state funded, non-profit group that provided community services to over 150,000 residents in Brooklyn, NY. During this time he was the President of the Canarsie Historical Society, one of the most active historical groups in Brooklyn. He wrote and produced two magazines on the history of Brooklyn and wrote hundreds of articles for two local weeklies, plus articles for the NY Times, the Daily News and several Archeology publications. He served five years as Secretary for the NYC Chapter of the NYS Archeology Society.

In 1986 Gov. Mario Cuomo appointed him to the NYS Constitutional Bi-Centennial Commission. And in

1988 he was an invited guest to the Reagan White House.

He moved to Brevard County in 1996 and has been very active in community affairs: serving as a board member of his home owners association for over a dozen years and as president for two years. For six years he served as a Regional Vice President for the National Spanish American War Veterans and was active in the



Liberty Bell Museums hundredth anniversary of the sinking of THE MAINE. As a long-time member of the Sons of Confederate Veterans he was their Public Relations Officer. For 20 years he has been an active member of the Brevard Chapter Sons of the American Revolution and has served as a board member for almost the entire time, rising to President. During this time he has participated in many parades, given hundreds of historical talks and rose to a State Regional Vice President for 4 years, and served as a Member At Large on the State Board of Directors for 2 years. He has received over a dozen medal for

his efforts, including the prestigious Patriot Medal presented to only 3 out of the 2,000+ state members each year and a Lifetime Achievement Medal from the Daughters of the American Revolution. In addition he was the creator and directed the ceremonies for The Last Naval Battle of the Revolutionary War which drew hundreds of marchers, at the Brevard Veterans Center on Merritt Island, for the first 9 years.

On a personal note, I will especially miss Ben as he was one of my two chapter mentors when I joined the S.A.R. He was quick to talk me into being an active officer and then strongly urged me to be active at the state level. He and some of the 'old-timers' kept the chapter alive during the lean years by continuing to step up and take positions and duties that no one else would take. That there still is a Brevard chapter is due to Ben, George Darby, Carl Green, John Davenport, John Dibble, Frank Smith, and Don Buchanan. It is unfortunate that so few of our current members know of these compatriots and appreciate their worth until their passing. RIP Ben.


President Roger Bonnett, Compatriots Sam Ashdown and Brian Jensen were also in attendance along with members of the Cape Canaveral

### Special Observance

Tuskegee Airman Edwin and wife Theda Cowan

Re-Committal services were held for Edwin and Theda Cowan at Cape Canaveral National Cemetery on 07 Feb 2019. Edwin was a flight officer during WWII with the Tuskegee Airmen. He later became a B-25 pilot with the 477th Bomb Group. After his military service he became a mail carrier earning his Bachelor's and Master's degree in Education. He worked for the Cleveland school system for 22 years and retired as Princi-





Theda passed away 12 Apr 2007 and Edwin died 20 Mar 2009. Their cremains were buried at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Merritt Island Fl at the grave site of her late mother,

Rebecca "Dearie" Sams.

Since they were buried in Rebecca's grave site a marker for Edwin and Theda was not allowed. The Veterans Center learned of the burials and recognized the importance of Edwin's service to our country. A two-year coordination with relatives, and various organizations, arrangements were made to locate their remains.

Edwin and Theda's family was present with four generations of descendants.
