Brevard's 33rd Annual Veterans Reunion

Brevard's DAR, SAR and Captain John Barry CAR Chapters participated in the opening and wreath presentation ceremonies at the 33rd Annual Veterans Reunion at Wickham Park in Melbourne FL April 12, 2021.

Each year the reunion starts out with an escort of the Vietnam Memorial Wall from Eastern Florida State College Cocoa Campus. Law enforcement stopped traffic so the procession was able to travel from the Cocoa Campus, to US1 and onto Wickham Park. News media referred this convoy as being miles long. In the past only motorcycles could escort the 35' trailer, however this year four wheeled vehicles were also allowed to join in on the motorcade. Brevard's Jeep and Corvette clubs joined in this year's procession.

The moving wall is 3/5 scale of the original, it is 288 feet long and 6 feet high. Once the caravan arrives volunteers under the supervision of the wall's caretakers erect the monument in about 2-1/2 hours. The base of the wall is beautifully landscaped to honor those to be remembered and provide a place for those who wish to leave keepsakes for their loved ones who are inscribed on the wall.

In front of the wall is a memorial dedicated to the dogs who served during our wars. Being an very important asset during times of conflict, dogs can smell and sense dangers around them and will alert their handlers of the situation. At the opening ceremonies multiple Veterans had dogs of the same breed they used during their service while on active duty.



This year's reunion had 50,000 visitors over the course of the week's activities.

Awards Banquet

Friday night's Awards Banquet President James G Ward was awarded the Service to Veterans Medal as well as the Service to Veterans Medal with 1st, 2nd and 3rd Bronze Oak Leafs. President Ward supports Veterans and military Pharmacies at Patrick Space Force Base, West Palm Beach and the Veterans Clinic in Viera.



Color Guard Training

The Florida Battalion had two excellent training classes on Friday beginning with Firelock Training on the safe handling of Revolutionary era firearms within close quarters and at events where Color Guard has been requested such as DAR and other related events.

Their second Color Guard training session was related to events that qualified for the three Color Guard Metals, Bronze, Silver and Gold. 1st being the Bronze for serving a minimum of three years and accruing 300 points, Chapter uniformed events are worth 5 points and State events are worth 10. 2nd the Silver can be earned in conjunction with the Bronze for attending (9 minimum) District and/or National Color Guard events. 200 additional points must be accrued. 20 points are earned for each State or National event. The Gold Color Guard Medal is awarded through National Color Guard procedures.

In addition, if a female relative or companion of a Color Guardsman who has earned the Silver Color Guard Medal and she has supported Color Guard activities by providing refreshments of other tangible items while wearing Revolutionary attire, then she qualifies for the Molly Pitcher Medal

MINUTES OF THE CHAPTER'S

REGULAR MEETING

Saturday, April 17, 2021

A regular meeting of the Brevard Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution took place at The Tides Collocated Club, 1001 North Highway A1A, South Atlantic Avenue, Patrick Space Force Base, FL 32925.

The meeting was attended by 22 SAR compatriots, 5 spouses and 2 guests including Compatriots Ashdown, Bisset, Brinckerhoff, Doug and Lona Burnett, Robbie Carlisle and his wife, Cole, Desmarais, Barry and Sharon Eller (DAR), Etherton, Herman, Humker, Ireland, Brian Jensen and his wife (DAR), Jay and Donna Longway, Maynard, Carl and Susan Miller, Mihora, Scarpate, Trousdale, Ward and Guest Speaker Dan Layton and his wife Zalenski. Compatriots Bisset, Desmarais, Jensen and Mihora attended in period attire.

The meeting was called to order by Chapter President James Ward at approximately 11:30 AM.

Chapter Secretary Jensen stated that a quorum was present.

Compatriots who are ill include Roger Bonnett, Ray Norman, Kent Buchanan, and Jason Conklin.

Attendees were asked to stand and were led in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance by President Ward followed by the SAR Pledge led by 2nd VP Scarpate.

President Ward offered the Invocation, invited the attendees to take their seats, and spoke of fellow compatriots that are currently dealing with health issues including Compatriots Bonnet, Buchanan, Norman and Conklin.

There were no current or past National or State Officers present.

President Ward acknowledged Past Chapter Presidents Desmarais, Eller, and Humker were in attendance. Past President of the Vero Beach Chapter, George Ireland was in attendance.

President Ward began the Officers Reports and gave credit to all that made the Last Naval Battle Ceremonies a success with special acknowledgements to the members of the chapter's Executive Committee, the Florida State President, and Compatriots Donn Weaver and Secretary Brian Jensen. 106 people attended this year's commemorative. Representatives from across the state as well as 2014-2015 President General Lindsey C. Brock; Central District Vice President General William E. Sharp, Georgia; SAR, DAR and CAR representatives from Ft Brooke, Tampa; Luke Winbun, CAR of Indiana; in addition to representatives from Brevard's Captain John Barry chapter. Several members in our chapter were unable to assist this year due to health or other issues. Members are needed to help

President Ward noted that next year's event is scheduled for the second Saturday in March at the Veteran's Memorial Center on Merritt Island. President Ward also noted the Liberty Tree Dedication and Highland County's 100th Anniversary.

Compatriots Tim Hicks, Brian Jensen, Nic Mihora and Donn Weaver represented The Brevard Chapter at the 31st Annual Veterans Reunion opening ceremonies. 112 Wreaths were placed in front of the Vietnam Memorial Moving Wall in tribute. The reunion had about 54,000 attendees over the course of the week's activities.

President Ward discussed the upcoming Board of Management (BOM) Meeting (April 30th thru May 2nd) and noted that he, Past President Bonnet and Secretary Jensen are confirmed delegates but that there is still one more delegate position available and to see him if interested in being the fourth delegate. If any delegate is unable to attend any Chapter member in good standing may be submitted to their place. The BOM is open to all Chapter members and all members are encouraged to attend. 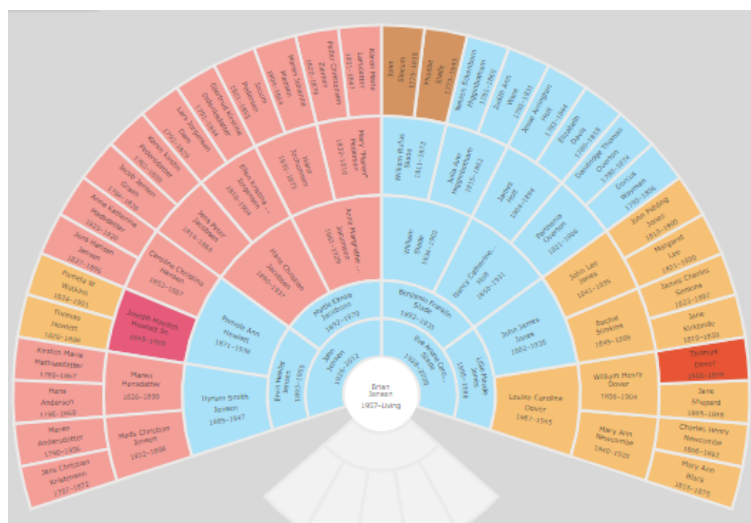

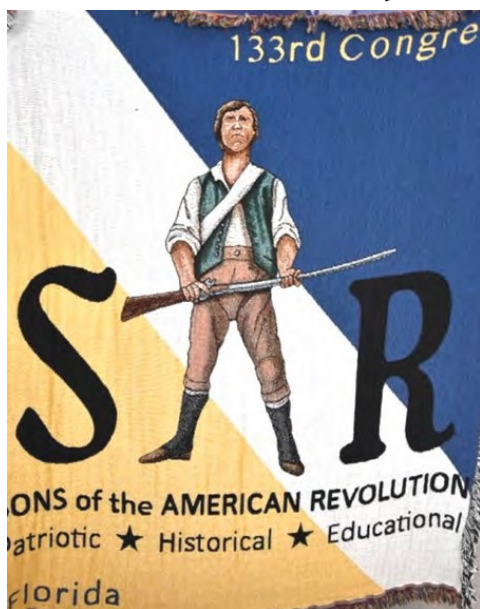

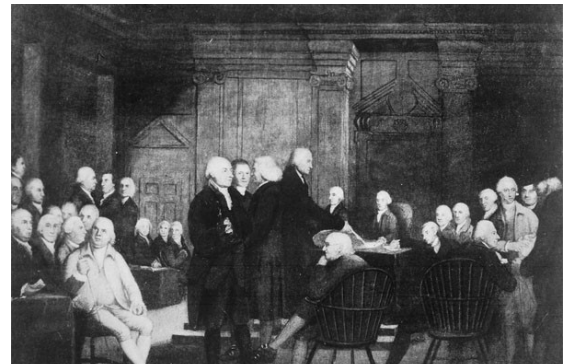
