FROM: MISSING IN AMERICA PROJECT – FL (MIAP)

YOU ARE NOT FORGOTTEN: Ceremony at Cape Canaveral National Cemetery on Dec 1, Honors 24 Veterans and 2 Spouses cremains that have previously gone unclaimed.

On December 1, 2021, under beautiful fall skies, per current VA protocol, a closed MIAP Call to Honor #28 was held at the Cape Canaveral National Cemetery (CCNC) located in Brevard County, FL. The solemn ceremony honored 24 veterans, and 2 spouses, who were recognized one by one and placed in a niche. The cremated remains of these veterans went unclaimed for an average of more than two decades. One remained in a funeral home storage vault for five decades. Many of the veterans served our country in times of conflict with 18 having served in World War II and two being sent into WWII, Korea, and Vietnam.

Special thanks to CCNC, Director Mr. Kevin Ridgeway, and the great CCNC staff for supporting a beautiful ceremony and making sure each veteran and spouse is now laid to rest with dignity and honor. Active-duty personnel from local units of all branches of service and some veteran organizations supported the ceremony, along with MIAP volunteers led by Kathy Church, Florida State MIAP Coordinator.

Difficult to accept, the reality is that funeral homes, Medical Examiners Offices, hospitals, and other private locations across the country are caretakers of unclaimed cremains. The Missing in America Project is a nationwide, nonprofit, 501c 3 volunteer organization.

The purpose of the MIA Project is to locate, identify and inter the unclaimed cremated remains of American veterans through the joint efforts of private, state, and federal organizations. To provide honor and respect to those who have served this country by securing a final resting place for these forgotten heroes. MIAP was founded in 2006 and operates in many states. Due to the high number of unclaimed cremains, there will be more ceremonies in the coming months and years at CCNC, which covers five East-Central Florida counties and as well as at all other National Cemeteries across the state.

MINUTES OF THE CHAPTER MEETING

Saturday, November 20, 2021

A regular meeting of the Brevard Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution took place at The Tides Collocated Club, 1001 North Highway A1A, South Atlantic Avenue, Patrick Space Force Base, FL 32925.

The meeting was attended by twenty (26) SAR compatriots including Sam Ashdown, Doug 'Doc' Bisset, Robert Brinkerhoff, Norm Desmarais, Thomas Dickman, Barry Eller, Joel Etherton, Carl Green, Laurie "LT" Herman, Robert Humker, George Ireland, Brian Jensen, Sonny Jones, Carl Miller, Nic Mihora, Ray Norman, Carl Oehmann, Rev, David Ralston, Christopher Ratzel, Jerry Scarpate, John Simmons, Lou Stocks III, Ted Trousdale, James Ward, and Donn Weaver. Compatriots Bissett, Jensen and Mihora attended in period attire; Compatriot Jones attended in Class A attire.

Guests attending included Sharyn Desmarais, a Daughter of the American Revolution (DAR), Barbara Dickman, Sharon Eller (DAR), Sandy Green, Janice Herman, Linda Jensen (DAR), Katherine Oehmann (DAR) and our guest speaker Mike Haridopolos.

The meeting was called to order by Chapter President James Ward at approximately 11:35 AM.

President Ward asked if we had a quorum and Secretary Jensen stated that there was a quorum present. President offered grace in advance of the meal.

Attendees were asked to stand and were led in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance by 1^{st} Vice President Etherton and the SAR Pledge by 2^{nd} Vice President Scarpate. Reverend David Ralston gave the invocation.

President Ward gave the Chaplain's Report which noted with sadness of the passing of Chapter member Robert Uhler whose funeral he attended along with Secretary Jensen. President Ward also provided well wishes and the hope for a speedy recovery for Compatriot Carroll Lord, longtime Chapter Treasurer, who is recuperating at home from quadruple by-pass surgery.

President Ward gave the Surgeon's Report noting that the World is still under the grips of the global pandemic and encouraged all to get vaccinated, get the booster shot and follow all appropriate protocols. And as a probable result of the pandemic Compatriot Ashdown noted that prospective member Roger Whitlam's application package has been at National for six weeks for processing.

President Ward also acknowledged the DAR members and the quest speaker as in-attendance as noted above.

President Ward began the Officer Reports with the **President's Report** noting as follows:

- Encouraged the membership to take advantage of the opportunity to fill current vacancies for the positions of Color Guard Commander. Veteran's Committee Chairman (noting our great success with the submittal of our award winning Stark Report), and Chapter Chaplain.
- Reminded the membership to contact him or Compatriots Etherton or the Chairman of the Nominating Committee, Past President Bonnett, to apply for, or suggest a candidates for, an Officer position for the 2022-2023 year which are scheduled to be installed at the May 2022 meeting.

Compatriot Joel Etherton gave the **1st Vice President's Report** noting that the December meeting would held at the Tides (followed by a round of applause for the caterer and Treasurer Herman by the attendees) and that the 2022 Last Naval Battle ceremonies would be held at the VMC.

Compatriot Jerry Scarpate gave the **2**nd **Vice President's Report** noting that anyone would like to serve as Committee Chairman of any of the various Youth Programs the organization sponsors should contact him. Youth Activities Chairman Ratzel also reported that we have no applications to date for the Eagle Scout Program and if we ultimately do not get any the prize money will rollover into the next year's program.

President Ward called Secretary Jensen to the podium to be recognized for a 3rd Place award in the Richard Q. Fowler Newsletter Contest for his achievements in editing and publishing the Chapter's monthly magazine, *The Brevard Beacon*, which was memorialized by an award letter, certificate and check for the Chapter in the amount of \$75 which was followed by a hearty round of applause

- He plans to participate in the virtual Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) Meeting No. 2 (via Zoom) at 7:45 PM EST, Tuesday, November 23, 2021.
- Working on an old membership packet for James Marion Boyd III and has found an address of his parents and will write his mother for information.

President Ward noted that the Chapter has two (2) approved membership packets for persons who have not been inducted due to the fact that they have not attended a meeting and as a result is rethinking the policy of not considering an approved applicant as a member unless he has attended a meeting and has been inducted?

- All are welcome to attend the 80th-Anniversary Ceremony commemorating the loss of life as a result of the attack on Pearl Harbor scheduled for December 7th at 2 PM EST at the VMC.
- The WAA touring caravan is scheduled to be at the VMC on the 4th and 5th of February, 2022.

Linda Jensen requested that someone attending the WAA wreath laying at the CCNC locate and place a wreath on the gravesite of Compatriot Robert Kercher and obtain images of the occasion to be sent to his wife, Dot, who is unable to visit the cemetery.

1st Member-at Large Bissett had nothing to report.

2nd Member-at-Large Compatriot Donn Weaver, who replaced Compatriot Sonny Jones, who resigned, had nothing to report.

Reverend Ralston said grace for the meal and luncheon was swerved.



Compatriot Miller introduced Mike Haridopolos, former member of the Florida House of Representatives and Florida State Senate President who gave a very interesting talk on what is happening in politics today which was followed by a question and answers session and which was well received by the members and guests.





"Sons of Liberty-1775" by James N. Muir depicts a typical Colonial Militia citizen-soldier on that date, the original "Patriots' Day" of 19 April 1775. The sculpture is historically authentic in every regard as to arms, accoutrements, clothing and hair style. He is carrying a captured 42-inch barrel "Short Land" Model 1740 British Musket adopted in 1765 to replace the earlier 46-inch first model "Long Land" or "Brown Bess" (which is depicted in the maquettes of "Sons of Liberty-1775). Powder and ball were carried either in a powder horn and pouch or preferably, as depicted, in the more military cartridge box in the form of pre-made paper or linen cartridges. A vent pick and frizzen brush hang handily from his vest.

This Limited Edition (#10/50) bronze sculpture will be raffled during the 133rd NSSAR Congress in Orlando, FL in 2023.
